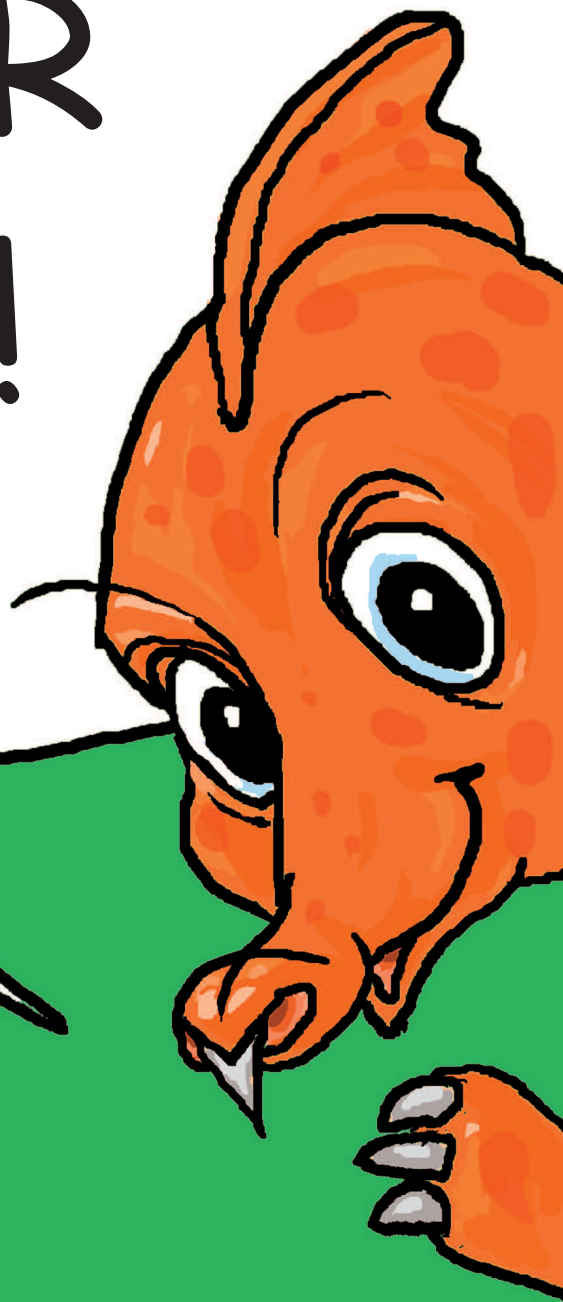

- all children have the right to say what they think and to be respected

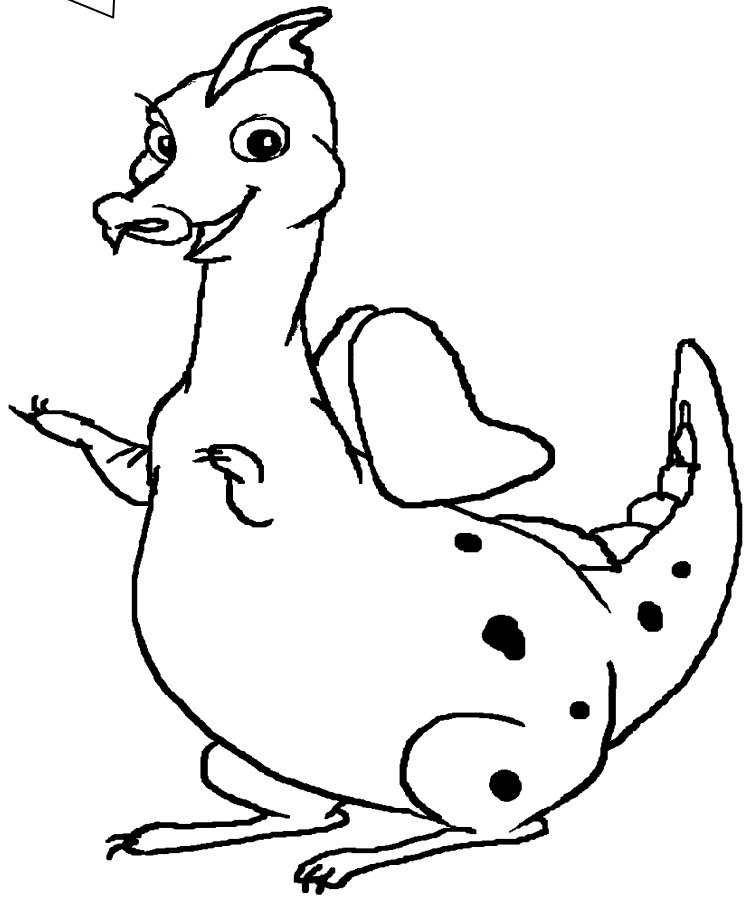

CHILDREN'S RIGHTS

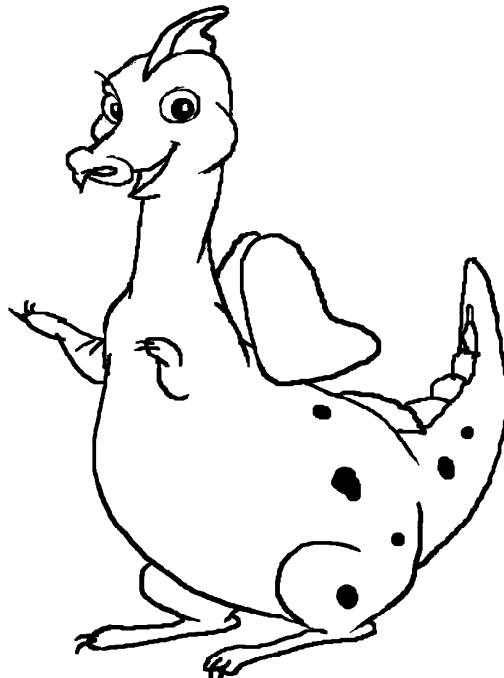
This is your book about children's rights. Everything written here is about you and all the children who are less than 18 years old in the whole world.
