

Manara Network Partners train on Child Rights Programming (CRP)

From October 17th till 20th, eight civil society organizations from the Middle East and North Africa Region participated in a training workshop on Child Rights Programming (CRP) through the Manara Network. Save the Children Sweden conducted the training workshop as a part of its ongoing commitment together with other



NGO members of the Network in the MENA region to support and strengthen the capacities of partners on the CRP component among other components of their work.

Dr. Alaa Sebeh conducted the training, through which partners have gained and built on their knowledge and expertise of CRP to develop their capacities further on it. Topics covered included the basic general principles of the CRC, in addition to the principles of CRP and its practices as well as Child Rights Situation Analyses. Furthermore, the relationship between “Advocacy” and “CRP” to revision of previous plans and programs, so that the partners are capable of creating their own planning of CRP related to their organizations work and country.
